**V.** The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows forth his handiwork.

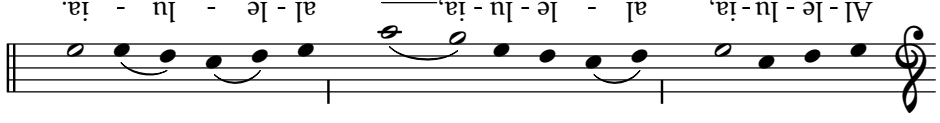
