PRELUDE

Ant. Roráte cæli désuper, et nubes pluant iustum: aperiátur terra, et gérmínet Salvatórem.

Ant. Bring forth dew, O heavens, from above, and may the clouds rain forth the Just One: may the earth be opened, and bring forth the Savior.

V. Cæli enarrant glóriam Dei, et ópera mánuum eius annúntiat firmaméntum.

V. The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament shows forth his handiwork.
