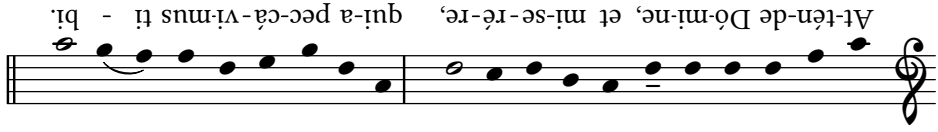


# FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

### INTROIT

*Hear us, O Lord, and have mercy upon us, for we have sinned against thee.*

V. The blameless one was seized, yet refused not to be led, condemned by false witnesses for the sake of wicked men: O Christ, save those whom thou hast re-deemed.

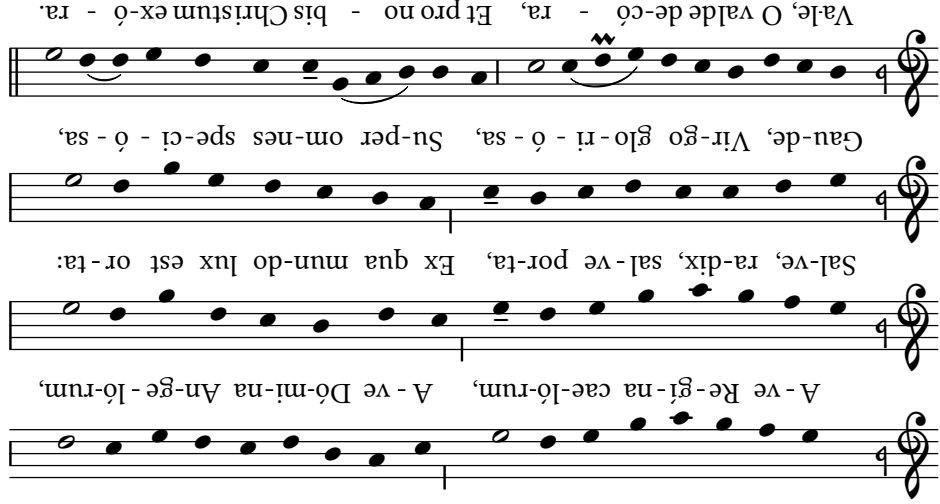
V. Scrutator alme cordium,

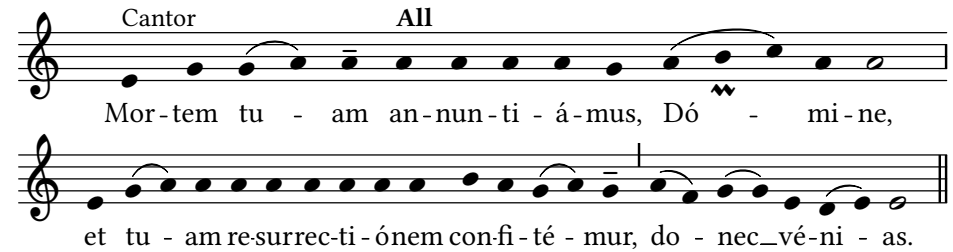
