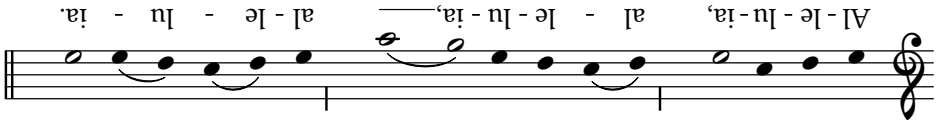

O Lord, who givest the sevenfold gift of the Spirit, by whom both heaven and earth are filled: have mercy on us.

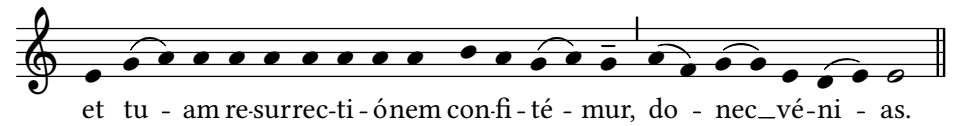
RECESSIONAL
