# FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## ST. PATRICK CATHOLIC CHURCH

### INTRODUCTION

Although today is the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, much of the music we will sing is taken from the liturgy for the Presentation of the Lord, celebrated on February 2. The texts speak of light: Christ, who is light of the world, the light of God's face, Our Lady under her title Star of the Sea. As we near the beginning of Lent and approach the darkness of Our Lord's Passion, we remember that "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (Jn 1:5) and ask for the grace to use profitably the coming season of fasting, enlightened by the uncreated light.
